

Direct Objects

- A direct object is receiving the action from the action verb.
- Direct objects **ONLY** come after an **ACTION VERB**.
- Follow these steps to find the direct object:
 1. Find the action verb.
 2. Then ask yourself who or what after the action verb.
 3. The direct object can **only** be a noun or pronoun.


Ex: The dog caught the ball.

Caught is the action verb.

Caught who? Nothing

Caught what? The ball. (ball is a noun so it is the direct object.)

Nick  **had visited** New York City over break.

Gia  **watched** several scary movies over the weekend.

Matthew was scared .

- 1. We attended a show on electricity.**
- 2. Later we visited the exhibit on natural history.**
- 3. My friends preferred the dinosaurs and other prehistoric animals.**
- 4. Mrs. Mrochko administered several tests and quizzes today.**
- 5. G Money had blown her money so she was broke.**
