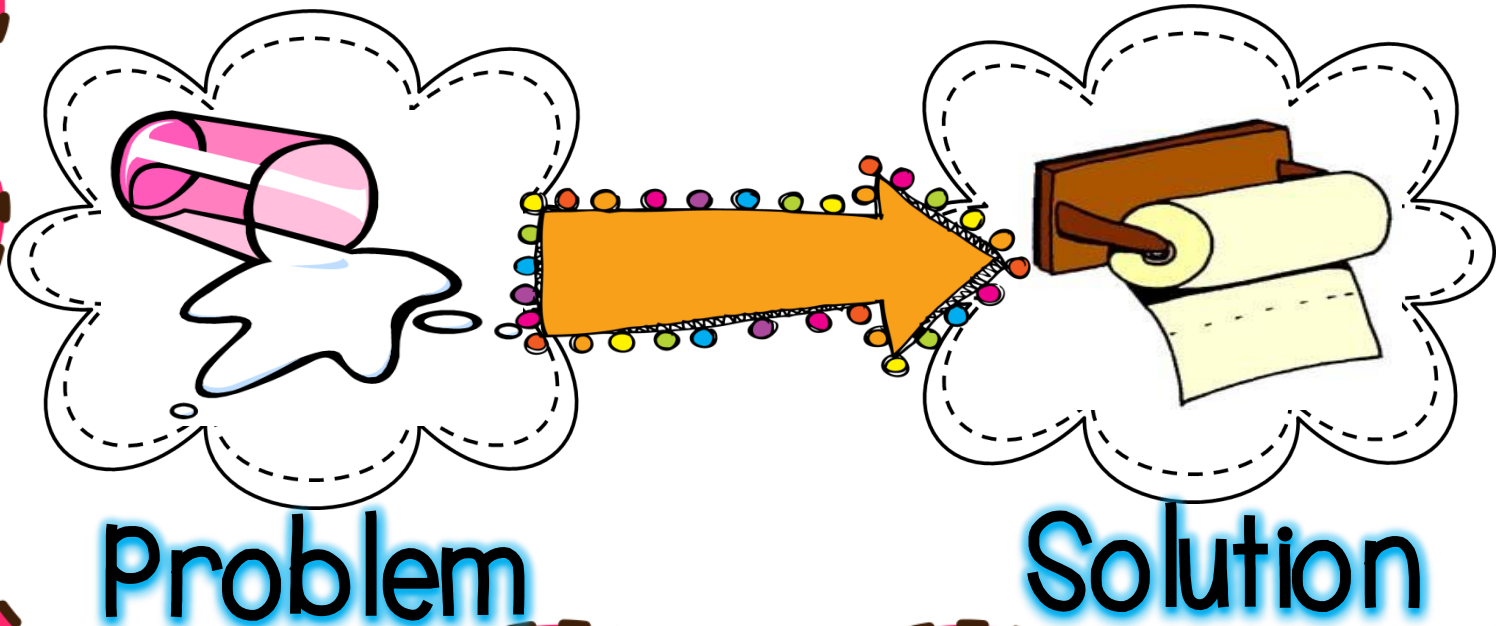

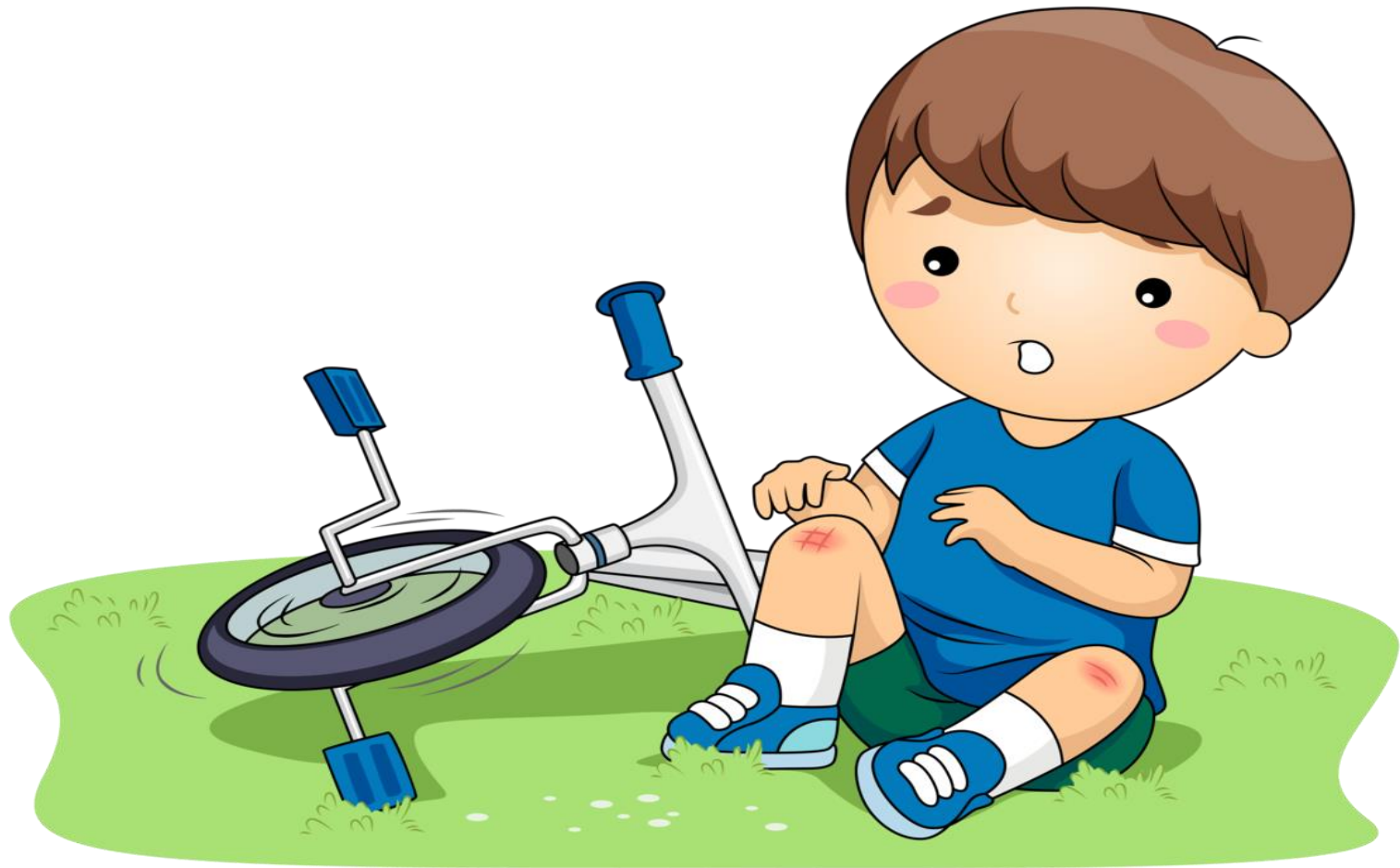
A problem is something a character wants to change, fix , or figure out.

A solution is the way a problem is fixed or solved.



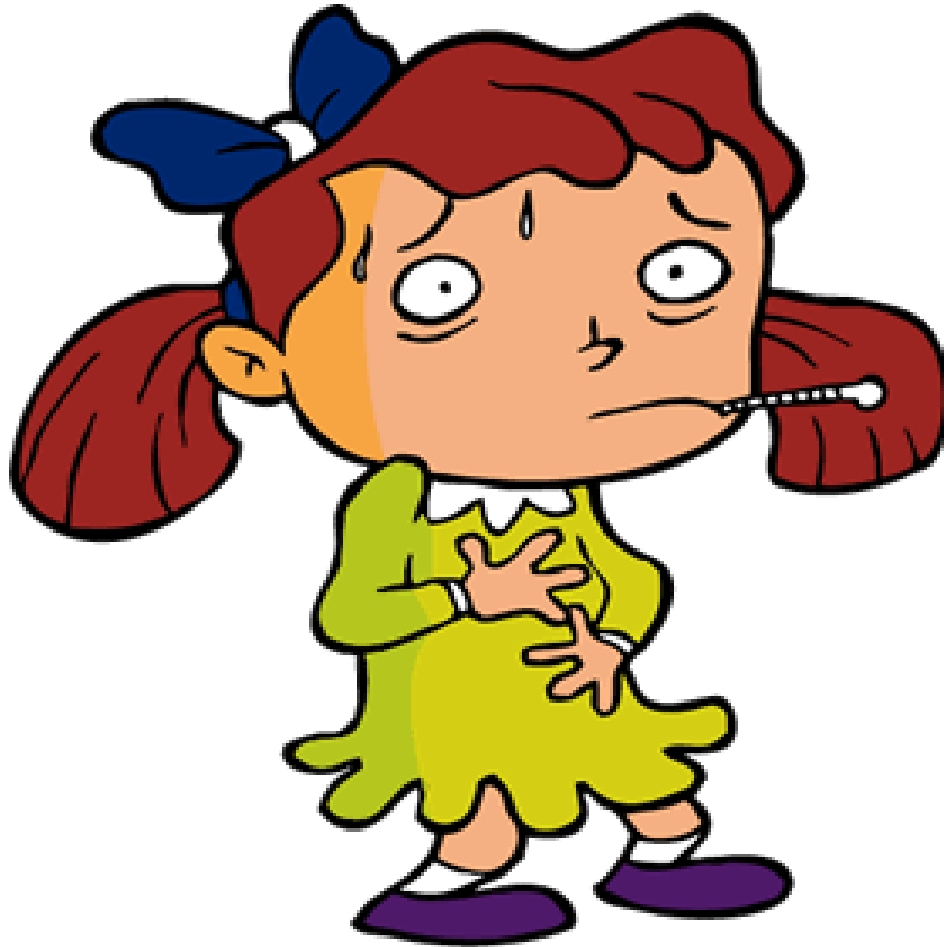
