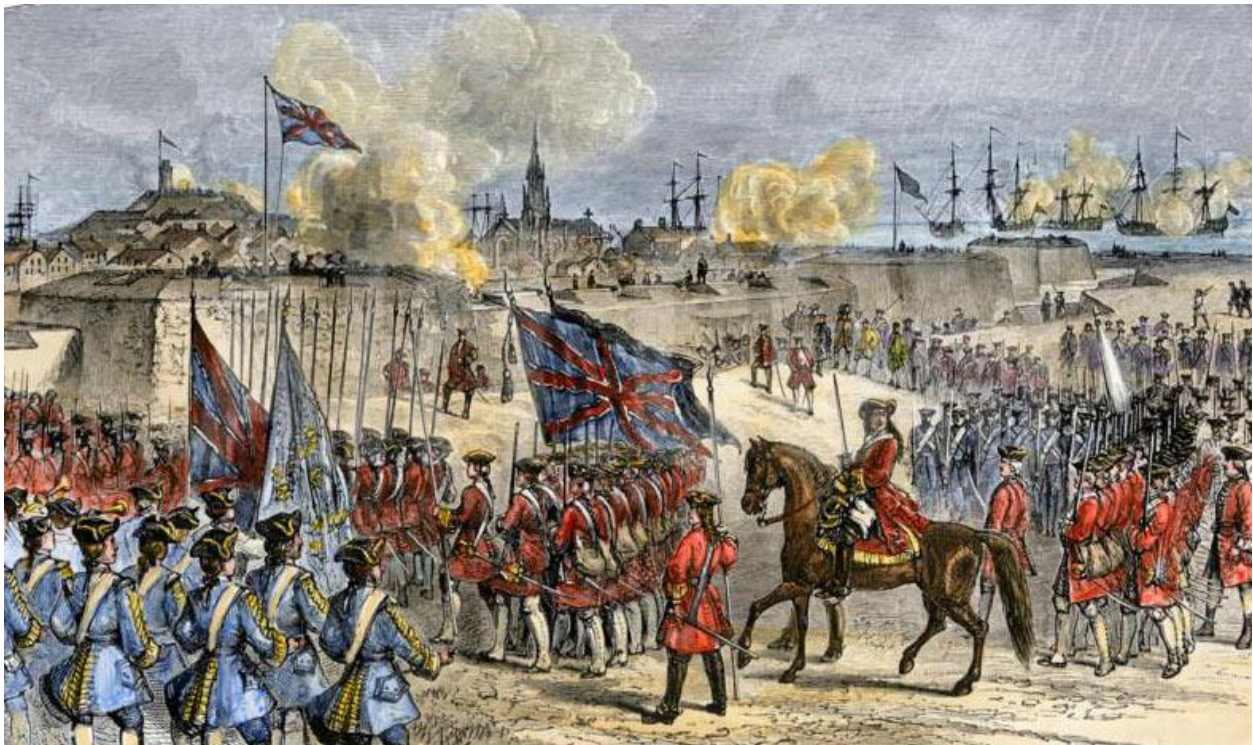


# The Tide Turns for Britain
