Principal's and Guidance Counselor's are asked to make a general announcement so that student body members have an opportunity, if eligible, to submit their application.



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Reverend Louis Garbacik Memorial Scholarship Fund Seeking Applicants for Annual Award

Thomas Kopetskie, President of the Reverend Louis Garbacik Memorial Scholarship Fund, has Announced that the Fund is seeking applicants for the annual scholarships to be awarded from the Fund. Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 - \$2,500 will be awarded to a male and a female high school senior from a high school located in the Greater Hazleton Area. Selection criteria will include, but not limited to, academic performance and class ranking, involvement in community, civic and church activities, and the objective evaluation of a required 1000 or more word essay pertaining to Polish and Polish American heritage, culture, ancestry and history, and recommendations from the principal, administrators, and guidance counselors at the applicants school. Applications are available at local high schools or by contacting Thomas Kopetskie, President, at 570-454-4397.

The Scholarship Fund was established in memory of the late Reverend Louis Garbacik, a Roman Catholic priest in the Diocese of Scranton, who promoted Polish and Polish American culture, heritage and ancestry. Scholarships can be used for education expenses at ant accredited post secondary course or technical school.

How are students selected?

Students are selected on the following basis:

1) Academic performance and class ranking

2) Active involvement in community, civic and church activities, with special consideration being given to those activities involving Polish or Polish American heritage and culture.

 An objective evaluation of a required 1000 or more word essay related to Polish or Polish American heritage, culture, ancestry and history.

4) Recommendations from respective school principles, administrators, and guidance counselors.

Relatives of members of the selection committee and the respective school principals, administrators, and guidance counselors are not eligible for awards. Relatives of officers, directors, or substantial contributors are eligible for awards because of the independent controls in place over the selection committee.

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## Questions:

- 1) Only scholarships will be provided, no fellowships or loans will be provided.
- 2) One year scholarships in the individual amount of \$1,000 \$2,500 total will be awarded to high school students who will attend an accredited public or private two or four year college or technical school upon graduation. The purpose of the scholarships will be to offset the student's cost of attending such post secondary schools. No scholarships will be awarded to students for the purpose of attending private high schools.
- 3) No educational loans will be awarded.
- 4) The program will be publicized through direct contact with the principal, administration, and guidance departments of the public and private high schools located in the Greater Hazleton, PA geographic area. In addition, public service announcements will be sent to local television, print, and radio media outlets that serve the previously noted schools.
- 5) specific criteria used to determine who is eligible include: Recipient must have at least one parent, grandparent, or great grandparent of Polish or Polish American ancestry. Recipient must be a high school senior graduate and fulfill all of the requirements to receive a diploma from a Pennsylvania high school. Recipient must be enrolled in accredited two or four year college or technical school.
- 6) Specific selection criteria include, but are not limited to, the following: Academic performance and class ranking. Active involvement in community, civic, and church activities with special consideration being given to those activities involving Polish or Polish American heritage and culture. An objective evaluation of a required 1000 or more word essay related to Polish or Polish American heritage, culture, ancestry and history. Recommendations from respective school principles, administrators and guidance counselors.
