Important Application Terms


TERM	Meaning	
Admissions Testing	A test you take to show the college how well you will do your freshman year	
ACT/SAT/Accuplacer	Standardized tests used by colleges for academic placement or admissions	
CEEB Code	Unique code used by high schools and colleges for identification	
Self-Reporting	Student enters their own grades into application portal	
Major/Minor	Subject area you study in school that will lead to a degree in that area	
Degree (AS,BS,BA)	Degree earned based on your years of study	
Rolling Admissions	There is no deadline for applying to this school or program	
Early Action	You are asking for an early response – schools have hard deadlines for this	
Early Decision	Is a BINDING contract you make with school stating that you WILL attend their school	
Deferred Admissions	After you are accepted you may be allowed to put going to college off for a sem or year	
Undergraduate	Any degree earned under 4 years	
Priority Date/Deadline	The time limit you have to apply to a school or program – Deadlines are final

Look for Admission or Apply Now


- The admissions tab is usually where you find the place to apply.

- Check to see if there is an application fee. Usually we can help you waive the fees. Come see us before you pay anything!

Follow Prompts

FERPA – Waive or not to Waive?

What does Waive mean?? The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, helps protect the privacy of student education records. The Act provides eligible students the right to inspect and review education records, the right to seek to amend those records and to limit disclosure of information from the records. It will allow you to see and review your recommendation letters **ITS YOUR CHOICE**

What is a FEE WAIVER

You are allowed to waive your fees because you participate in FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH It's a Federal Program that all our students Qualify for which allows you to receive Free applications from colleges. Not all schools do this but most do! Check - I participate in a federal lunch program Also check I receive SAT fee waiver

Important Common App Terms

TERM	Meaning		
GPA	Your grade average of all your classes since 9 th grade		
Weighted/non Weighted	Classes that have extra value added to them so an 100 in one class will equal 101 in another class. OUR GPAs are Weighted		
Class Rank	Where you stand in line compared to your classmates. 1 out of 818 – its EXACT		
Name Prefix/Suffix	It's the title before your name – Mr., Mrs., Dr. or after Junior, II, III It's personal to you		
U Strive	Is a free college mentorship program.		
Parent Education	If you don't know you can leave blank or guess		
Personal Essay	Writing an essay based on you to let college know a little about you		
Early Action	You are asking for an early response – schools have hard deadlines for this		
Early Decision	Is a BINDING contract you make with school stating that you WILL attend their school		
Deferred Admissions	After you are accepted you may be allowed to put going to college off for a sem or year		
Date you entered HASD	September 2020 – If you came in later then put date down and year you entered your previous school. They will need your previous school name		
Priority Date/Deadline	The time limit you have to apply to a school or program – Deadlines are final		

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
