BLACK HISTORY MONTH



Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history. Today we look at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. As a Civil Rights leader, Dr. King never backed down in his stand against racism. He was a courageous hero who inspired millions of people. He experienced racial prejudice from the time he was very young, which inspired him to dedicate his life to achieving equality and justice for Americans of all colors. King believed that peaceful refusal to obey unjust law was the best way to bring about social change. He was arrested several times during his lifetime due to his protests. Presidential candidate John F. Kennedy interceded to have King released from jail. Dr. King and his wife, Coretta Scott King, lead demonstrators on a historic march in 1965. Starting in Selma, Alabama, where local African Americans had been campaigning for the right to vote, King led thousands of nonviolent demonstrators 54 miles to the state capitol of Montgomery. He is also known for giving his now famous "I Have A Dream" speech in Washington DC in which he boosted public support for civil rights. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated on April 4, 1968. We honor him the third Monday of January each year, Martin Luther King Day.


