The CONSEQUENCES of ILLEGAL DUMPING

What is illegal dumping?

Illegal dumping is the dumping of a waste illegally in a public place. For example on a curb or in the street.

Why is illegal dumping an issue?

Illegal dumping can bring rodents and insect which can cause diseases. This is one of the many problems that illegal dumping can bring. The government has to spend millions of tax dollars to pick up unwanted trash.

Why is E-waste an issue?

Electronics like TVs, computers and other electronic waste have cathode ray tubes which contain lead. Lead is a hazardous material. E-waste should be properly disposed of by a certified hazardous waste hauler.

What is something that can be done to prevent illegal dumping?

It is believed that periodic neighborhood cleanup projects discourage illegal dumping. Illegal dumping is less likely to happen in a clean, watched neighborhood. People caught dumping can also be fined up to 10,000 dollars and face up to 6 months in prison.

What is something that could be done to prevent illegal dumping?
One way that can prevent it is doing neighborhood cleanup projects, which discourage it.

Don't Trash the Neighborhood

Why is E-waste an issue?
E-waste is an issue due to it being certified as a hazardous waste hauler, which means that it releases pollution, which then in turn damages the environment.

Why is this an issue?

This is an issue due to it causing environmental harm, damaging the grass and drinking water that's around you.

What is Illegal Dumping?

Illegal dumping is disposal of trash, that is located at one area and disposed of in another area without any legal permission given to them.

THE PROBLEM WITH PLASTIC

1. How are plastic products created?

Plastics are made from oil, a nonrenewable natural resource limited in supply. They are also made from coal and natural gas. The process of making plastics is usually quite complicated. Recycling plastic is also very difficult to do.

2. Why is making plastic an issue?

Making plastic requires large quantities of water and energy resources. The manufacturing of plastic also produces harmful chemicals that if not properly treated may pollute our water and air systems. Plastic is filling up our landfills and if it is burned, it releases toxic fumes. If we do not recycle, it becomes waste.



3. What is the problem with plastic waste?

The problem with plastic waste is that the plastic is designed to break down into smaller pieces when exposed to sunlight. They do not decompose when they are disposed of in landfills. Plastic waste may end up on streets and in the ocean. Marine animals mistake many plastic items floating in the ocean as food, which may injure or kill them.



4. What is something that can be done to reduce plastic waste?

We can recycle plastic to help reduce plastic waste. By recycling, the plastic can be used to make other plastic products. We can also use reusable bottles, bags, and containers and purchase products with less packaging to help reduce the waste.

Plastics are made from oil, a non-renewable resource limited in supply.

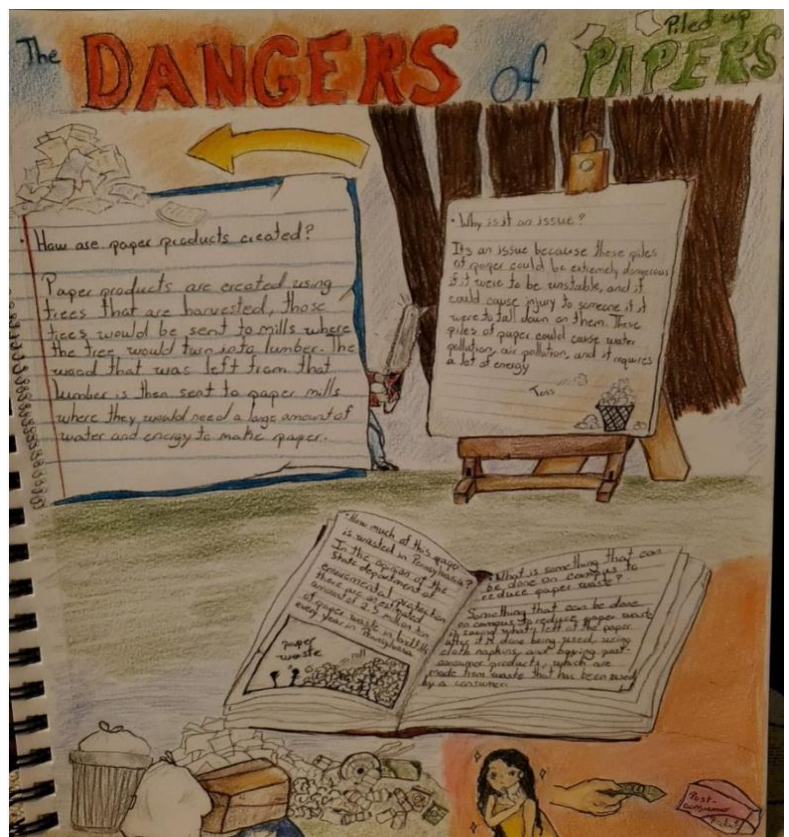


Why is this an issue?

Manufacturing plastic requires large quantities of water and energy resources. Plastic produces harmful chemicals that if not properly treated may pollute our water and air systems.

What is the problem with plastic waste?

90% is not recycled with plastic waste. In LA alone ten metric tons of plastic (bags, straws and soda bottles) are carried into the Pacific Ocean. Plastics are only designed to break down smaller when exposed to sunlight. They DO NOT decompose when in landfills!

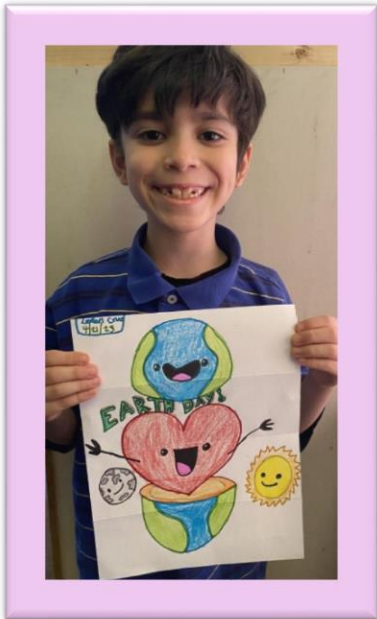
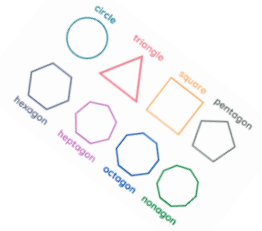
